Economy Taking Its Toll - During this past year, several of our scholarship program sponsors have let us know that they are unable to continue their support, for most part, due to the

Here are our four students in waiting, and just a little of their personal stories:

Cristian Geovani Miranda Escalante attends high school on Saturdays so that he can help support himself and his



grandparents by working in the fields during the week. Amazingly, he's been able to maintain a 79% grade point average on his core class work. His long-term goal is to go to the university and study medicine. A supportive sponsorship of \$375 annually for the next three years will get him through high school.

Andrea Yesica Gomez Ramirez has been in our scholarship program since 2007. She is in elementary school, at the age of twelve. Her annual sponsorship right now is \$275. As soon as she begins high school, her tuition needs will increase and the annual sponsorship will be \$375.
